## **JOB SUMMARY**

The Group Services Worker is responsible for providing a variety of group psychosocial rehabilitation services for adults with serious mental illness.

## **KEY DUTIES - RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Develop and provide group services that promote successful community living; assist clients to learn daily life and living skills; provide social-recreational opportunities; and foster peer support and self-help
- Planning, coordinating and, to the extent possible, co-leading life skills groups, social-recreational activities and psychoeducational/support groups
- Increase the capacity, accessibility, range and effectiveness of group services and activities offered by the housing program.
- Collaborate with co-workers, colleagues and other stakeholders in planning and delivery of group services and activities.
- Increase the capacity of the local mental health system to provide group services and activities for those with serious mental illness and their families
- Involved in program planning, evaluation and public relations activities, working closely with service providers, consumer/survivors, and other stakeholders in the planning and delivery of mental health services and community supports and related activities
- Maintain written clinical and program records according to program and organizational standards
- Consult and collaborate with consumer/survivors, service providers and other stakeholders regarding psychosocial rehabilitation needs that could be addressed via group services
- Plan and deliver educational events and develop educational resource materials for service providers, consumer/survivors, and the general public
